After a strange winter, we seem to being entering an even stranger spring! With a week of summer-like weather, we're back to our regular April programming, where lots of rain and even some snow is still on the table. I hope that this false start didn't prompt any early garden clean-outs, as this is still an important time for ground nesting insects. Resist the urge to cut back stems or clear out your leaves! Don't worry, gardening season is just around the corner.



Gotta catch 'em all!


I don't know about you, but this time of year can often feel like a big game of Pokemon Go for spring ephemerals! These plants are only seen during a very brief window in early spring, before the trees have fully leafed out and shaded the understory. Now is the time to explore your local forest floor for trilliums, bloodroot, spring beauties, hepatica, dutchmans breeches, and more! If you want an extra challenge, look for a more rare species of trout lily - *Erythronium albidum* or white trout lily. Compared to it's yellow kin, *Erythronium americanum*, it is much less common and extra special to find. This one pictured was found at the Humber Arboretum last spring, which is a wonderful place for a spring ephemeral hunt!

DIY Pollinator Kits

It's that time of year again! Our DIY Pollinator Kits are now available for pre-order. Similar to last year, our kits will be available for pick up at select markets throughout the GTA. A complete list with dates is below.

This year, we have 3 distinct kits: Meadow, Shade, and Rain. Our Meadow kit will have species of drought-tolerant, sun loving species, our Shade kit will have some woodland and shadetolerant species, and our Rain kit will have plants that can collect rain and stormwater runoff when planted in a low-lying area or near a downspout (learn more about rain gardens here. Each kit will contain 6 different species, for 15 plants total, with the option to add 10 extra plants for only \$50. This year we have partnered with BIOS Nutrients in order to provide some extra support for your plants! In addition to our favourite soil amendment, Jocelyn's Soil Booster, we will now have the BIOS Fertilizer and Plant Probiotic. The Fertilizer helps to add microbes to spent soil, so we recommend it along with our Meadow kit. The Plant Probiotic can help with the common plant disease powdery mildew, which is especially prevalent on monarda species. We recommend it for our Shade kit. Each kit will come with one of these three plant products of your choice. Pre-order today to guarantee your Pollinator Kit!


